

How to Protect Your Classic Car





Document its life.

- Store all of the original manuals and historic photos.
- Keep a running record of the car's maintenance and repair history.
- Take photos each year. This will help you notice any small deteriorations in the vehicle's condition.



Maintain it.

- Find a reliable mechanic who specializes in your marque.
- Keep up on regular maintenance for your vehicle.
- Drive it at least every few weeks, to maintain proper lubrication and identify any issues.



Store it properly.

- Find a climate-controlled storage facility or make sure your garage is linked to your home's fire detection system and is free of hazards that could harm your car, such as power tools or kid's toys.
- If you're storing your car for a long time, prepare it ahead of time. Drain or treat the fuel and take steps to prevent rodent infestations.
